## 2 Motion to Approve October 23, 2019 TPO Executive Board Minutes

The TPO staff has compiled the rankings that were submitted by Technical Committee voting members and is being presented for final recommendation to the Executive Board. #### 6 Americans with Disabilities Act Transition Plan Status

Item Summary: FHWA is responsible to ensure compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) in the public right-of-way and on projects using federal surface transportation funds. In accordance with this requirement, TDOT in coordination with the FHWA is tasked with ensuring that sub-recipients have completed their ADA Transition Plans. The deadline for the submission of completed ADA Transition Plans and Self-Evaluation Forms is December 31, 2019. Staff has compiled a summary of the ADA Transition Plan Status for affected local public agencies in the TPO Planning Area.

#### 7 Comments from TDOT Commissioner Clay Bright

Commissioner Clay Bright introduced himself to the TPO Executive Board and briefly shared his visions on ongoing congestion, projects included in the 3-Year Plan, being open to the shifting of priority projects, and lastly the need for multimodal transit. Commissioner Bright stated that we owe it to the community to work together and help bring resolutions to the table that makes the quality of life so much better!

## 8 Overview of Federal Highway Administration Certification Process of the TPO

#### 10 Public Comment

Mayor Rogero introduced Anne Wallace, Deputy Director of Redevelopment, was present and explained invited Executive Board members to the ribbon-cutting of the North Central Street Project this morning at 11:00 a.m. at the corner of Baxter Avenue and Central Street. This project used Federal Highway funds through the STBG Program. Mrs. Wallace went on to explain that over \$6,000,000.00 of investments went towards infrastructure, the addition of 43,000 square feet of new linear green space, the addition of 47 benches, 1.1 miles of new bike lanes, on-street parking, new bike racks, and bus shelters all with the support of partners from the Knoxville Area Transit. Mrs. Wallace thanked the Board for their support, partnership and funding of this project!

Mayor Tom Taylor congratulated and thanked both Mayor Rogero and Vice-Mayor Saunders on their service to the City of Knoxville!
