The projects consist of the Woodland Avenue Complete Street, Liberty Street Multimodal Project, and the First Creek Greenway - Broadway Streetscape. 6 Motion to Approve the Section 5310 Program of Projects

Item Summary: The TPO is the designated recipient of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310 funds. Section 5310 funds can be used for both operating and capital funding for projects that support seniors and persons with disabilities. Often non-profits utilize this funding to buy vans to provide transportation for their clients. The TPO held an open and publicly advertised Call-for-Projects. Discussion: Doug Burton specified that the TPO is the designated recipient of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310 funds. 7 Presentation of TDOT 3-Year Program of Projects

Presenter: Dexter Justice and Troy Ebbert, TDOT Staff

Item Summary: Dexter Justice, Director, TDOT Region One Project Development, and Troy Ebbert, Planning Supervisor, TDOT Long Range Planning Division, Office of Community Transportation, presented on the 3-Year Program of Projects adopted by the Tennessee legislature. Mr. Ebbert touched on project criteria and criteria weight used to rank projects. Mr. Justice reviewed project phase development and summarized the 2020 project rankings and the 3-Year Plan for the Knoxville TPO jurisdictions. He then gave an update on the Blount County Relocated Alcoa Highway project. Mr. Justice entertained questions from Board members. 8 Reports from our FHWA and TDOT Partners

Item Summary: Reports from our FHWA and TDOT Partners.

Discussion: Sean Santalla, Federal Highway Administration, TN Division, highlighted the RAISE notice of funding opportunity. This is a Discretionary Grant program that was announced a few months ago from USDOT, formerly known as BUILD and TIGER programs. MPO staff statewide have been notified. The deadline for this is grant is July 12th. Next week FHWA is hosting a webinar on the effectiveness of performance-based planning and programming for state DOT's and MPO's. This will be showcasing the results of a long-term research study on performance

planning and programming practices. FHWA is currently reviewing the Knoxville Regional TPO FY22-23 Transportation Planning Work Program. Lastly Mr. Santalla applauded the TPO's efforts to hold hybrid meetings which enhance public input and participation, a priority for FHWA.

Matt Meservy, Director, TDOT Long Range Planning Division noted that last week it was announced that Knox County and Blount County were two of the awardees of the most recent round of a Multimodal Access Grant, each receiving \$950,000 for multimodal projects. He also noted that TDOT received 38 applications / letters of interest for the CMAQ (Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality) Call for Projects for this year's cycle. Thirty-five of these will be moving forward to full applications which are due July 12th.
