2 Motion to Approve February 14, 2023 TPO Technical Committee Minutes

Item Summary: Approval of the February 14, 2023 TPO Technical Committee Minutes.

A Motion was made by Blake Sartin and seconded by Kathryn Baldwin to approve the February 14, 2023 TPO Technical Committee Minutes. The Motion carried unanimously 19-0.

3 Election of Officers

Item Summary: The representation on the Technical Committee and Executive Board for the City of Oak Ridge has changed. Patrick Berge, Public Works Director, will now represent them on the Technical Committee. Wayne Blasius was elected Chair last month. Therefore, for the Technical Committee, we need to select a new Chair and Vice Chair. Such elections shall be by a majority vote of the membership.

Discussion: Jeff Welch discussed the election of TPO Technical Committee Officers.

A Motion was made by Chico Messer and seconded by Kathryn Baldwin to nominate Jack Qualls as the 2023-2024 TPO Technical Committee Chair. The Motion carried unanimously 18-0.

A Motion was made by Chico Messer and seconded by Daryl Smith to nominate Jim Snowden as the 2023-2024 TPO Technical Committee Vice-Chair. The Motion carried unanimously 18-0.

4 FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program

Item Summary: Motion to Recommend Approval of a Resolution Adopting Amendments to the FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), the associated Air Quality Conformity Report and Certifying that the Metropolitan Planning Process is being Followed to the Executive Board. TDOT and locally requested amendments for three (3) air quality non-exempt projects.

Staff Recommendation: Approve

Discussion: Craig Luebke reviewed the locally requested amendments for two (2) air quality non-exempt projects. Draft Amendment 23-2020-012 [Attachment 4D] was removed from consideration by TDOT.

A Motion was made by Brian Boone and seconded by Chico Messer to recommend approval of a Resolution Adopting two (2) Amendments to the FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), the associated Air Quality Conformity Report and Certifying that the Metropolitan Planning Process is being Followed to the Executive Board. The Motion carried unanimously 20-0.

5 FTA Urban Area Transit Program of Projects

Item Summary: Motion to Recommend Approval: The Program of Projects (POP) is a list of projects, for each agency, to be funded with the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5307, 5310, and 5339 funding. FTA requires a public hearing on the POP. The POP public hearing

will be at the April 26, 2023, Executive Board meeting. Staff will update the Technical Committee on the FY23 FTA apportionments and the local distribution of funds. Because the TIP already has the Section 5307, 5310, and 5339 funding pages approved, the new funds and projects will be added through internal adjustments.

Staff Recommendation: Approve

Discussion: Doug Burton reviewed the current Program of Projects (POP).

A Motion was made by Chico Messer and seconded by Kathryn Baldwin to recommend approval of the 2023 Program of Projects (POP) including the FY23 FTA apportionments and the local distribution of funds to the Executive Board. The Motion carried unanimously 20-0.

6 Update on Safety Plan

Item Summary: Staff will provide an update on the progress toward creating a Roadway Safety Action Plan for the Knoxville region. Once complete, this plan will make our region and the local governments in it eligible to receive implementation grants through the Safe Streets and Roads for All program.

Discussion: Ellen Zavisca shared an update on the creation of a Roadway Safety Action Plan and its subsequent benefits.

7 Update on the EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant

Item Summary: The EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG) program will provide grants to develop and implement plans for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and other harmful air pollution. Planning grants go to the 67 most populous Metropolitan Statistical Areas (Knoxville is No. 64) and each will receive \$1 million dollars. The funding is to support efforts by states, municipalities, air pollution control agencies, tribes, among other groups. Planning funds can be used to update existing climate, energy, or sustainability plans, or to develop new plans. There will be \$4.6 billion for competitive implementation grants at a later date. 8 Priority Populations 2022 Update: Socioeconomic Challenges in the Knoxville Region

Item Summary: The Priority Populations dataset identifies communities facing greater social and economic equity challenges within the Knoxville region. The 2022 update of this dataset is accompanied by a technical report, which includes an explanation of the 27 indicators used to calculate ratings across four themes and a final, priority score. 9 TDOT Project Update – Alcoa Highway (SR-115/US-129) from Woodson Drive to Cherokee Trail

Item Summary: The next phase of the major reconstruction of Alcoa Highway is scheduled to be bid for construction in the May 2023 letting. TDOT staff will provide an overview of the project scope, construction schedule and features of the design.

Discussion: TDOT Region 1 staff Christie Brown gave an overview of the entire Alcoa Highway project in both Knox and Blount counties. Eric Wilson, also with TDOT, then gave a detailed overview of the Alcoa Highway project from Woodson Drive to Cherokee Trail.
