SUBJECT: Distribution of the FTA Section 5307 & Section 5339 Urban Area Funding

Federal Transit Administration - Fiscal Year 2023 - Section 5307 & 5339 Funding

As in recent years, Congress passed the FY 2023 transportation budget through continuing resolutions. On December 29, 2022, President Biden signed the Consolidated Appropriations Act, which contained the full year of funding (federal Fiscal Year 2023 runs from October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023). In late January, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) published in the Federal Register the urban area FY 2023 funding appropriation amounts for Knoxville.

The City of Knoxville is the Designated Recipient of the FTA Section 5307 and Section 5339 funding. On April 26, 2017, with the City of Knoxville's concurrence, the TPO Executive Board approved the Section 5307 and Section 5339 urban area funding distribution agreement. This agreement is based on set percentages for how the Section 5307 funds will be distributed each year to KAT, Knox County CAC Transit, and ETHRA. As the Section 5339 funds are limited for use by fixed-route transit providers, those funds go exclusively to KAT.

In 2020, at the request of the TPO Executive Board, a sub-committee reviewed the Section 5307 urban area funding distribution percentages. The Executive Board accepted the sub-committee's recommendation that the current distribution method remain unchanged for the immediate future, pending official results from the 2020 census. Given that the FY 2023 amounts still reflect the 2010 census, I am recommending that the FTA funding be divided to each agency based on the existing distribution agreement.

While the Section 5307 Urban Area Program for the Knoxville urban area saw an increase in funding for FY 2023, these funds were allocated on a formula that utilizes 2010 Census numbers. It is our understanding that FTA will use the 2020 urban area Census numbers starting in FY 2024. FTA uses a complicated formula which includes a variety of data such as: population, land area, and density as well as transit ridership and revenue hours statistics. While we feel the funding levels should not be dramatically impacted by the new urban area boundary, there is still a level of uncertainty so agencies should be cautious and plan accordingly.





FTA Required Program of Projects (POP) & Public Hearing & Next Steps

It is a requirement of the FTA that a hearing be held to allow for public input regarding the proposed Program of Projects (POP). The POP is a list of transit projects for each agency to be funded with the Section 5307 and 5339 funding. The public hearing on the POP has been conducted as part of the TPO Executive Board meeting for the last eight years. The POP public hearing will be held during the Executive Board meeting on April 26, 2023. After the Executive Board meeting, the TPO staff will add the funds and projects into the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Also, concurrently, I will send a letter to the FTA Region 4 Administrator detailing each agency's amount of Section 5307 funding they are to receive.

<u>Section 5307 – FTA Urban Area Funding</u>

Section 5307 funding can be used for capital, maintenance, limited operating, and administration. Table One shows the Section 5307 Knoxville urban area funding apportionments since FY 2018. For FY 2023, the Knoxville urban area received \$8,503,793 which is an increase of \$161,686 over the FY 2022 allocation.

Section 5339 – FTA Bus & Bus Facilities

Section 5339 – Bus & Bus Facilities funding, can be used for a variety of capital projects including the purchase of vehicles, maintenance equipment, transit amenities (benches and shelters), and technology, etc. Table Three shows the amount of Section 5339 funding apportioned to the urban area for FY 2023 is \$705,601. The FY 2023 amount reflects an

increase of \$18,071 when compared to FY 2022. All funding goes to KAT per the distribution agreement.
