2. Minutes*

Approved 16-0-0

Mr. Sartin moved to approve the minutes of the January 14, 2025 Technical Committee meeting as presented. Ms. Baldwin seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.



3. FY 2023 – 2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Project Cost Overruns*

There are four (4) cost overrun requests for locally sponsored projects. The overruns exceed the limits established in the TIP programming policies adopted with the FY 23-26 TIP. Technical Committee approval is required for cost overruns in excess of 25% of the total project costs or increasing TPO federal funds in excess of \$500,000.

Knoxville - Traffic Signal Improvements for the U.T. Area: Overrun request (CMAQ PM 2.5 funds) is \$2,620,911 (\$2,620,911 federal/\$0 local), representing 88.3% of the total project cost. The overrun request is for \$425,000 for ROW in FY 2025 and \$2,195,911 for CN in FY 2026. The overrun request is contingent on TDOT approval and permission to carry over approximately \$1M of CMAQ PM 2.5 funds from FY 2025 to FY 2026.

Knoxville - Traffic Control Equipment Upgrade: Overrun request (CMAQ PM 2.5 funds) is \$921,425 (\$921,425 federal/\$0 local), representing 7.6% of the total project cost.

Knoxville - Pleasant Ridge Road: Overrun request (L-STBG funds) is \$5,813,395 (\$4,650,716 federal/\$930,143 local), representing 71.1% of the total project cost.

Knoxville - Liberty Street Multimodal Project: Overrun request (L-STBG-TA funds) is \$823,019 (\$658,415 federal/\$164,604 local), representing 57.0% of the total project cost.

4. FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendments*

The City of Knoxville requested the following amendments:

Existing Pleasant Ridge Road project - Amend project to revise the project schedule and increase the construction phase cost and total project cost. Construction is programmed in FY 2025 at a total cost of \$14,784,512 (\$9,048,890 federal L-STBG/\$2,262,222 local/\$3,474,400 local non-participating). This amendment adds \$9,287,795 (+\$4,650,716 federal/+\$1,162,679 local/+\$3,474,400 local non-participating) to the project and the TIP. The total project cost is increased to \$17,459,821.

Existing Liberty Street Multimodal project - Amend project to revise the project schedule and increase the construction phase cost and total project cost. Additional PE-D programming is removed. Construction is programmed in FY 2025 at a total cost of \$1,525,419 (\$561,920 federal L-STBG/\$658,415 federal L-STBG-TA/\$305,084 local. This amendment adds \$817,555 (+\$658,415 federal L-STBG-TA/-\$4,371 federal L-STBG/+\$163,511 local) to the project and the TIP. The total project cost is increased to \$2,262,455.

The UPWP must take into consideration both the Federal Planning Factors and the Statewide Planning Priorities. The first draft is due to TDOT in April so Technical Committee members should bring forth planning efforts they would like to see addressed by the TPO.

7. West Knoxville Corridor (I-40/75) Study Presentation

TDOT has started an effort to study, design, and prioritize improvements to the Interstate 40/Interstate 75 corridor west of Knoxville, from the I-40/I-75 Interchange in Loudon County to the I-640 Interchange just west of downtown. TDOT 10-Year Project Plan, released in December 2023, identified funding for several projects along the corridor. Instead of treating those projects as isolated segments, TDOT plans to develop a holistic strategy for improving the corridor as a whole. TDOT staff and its consultants will provide a brief overview of the study and current status at this early stage with the intent of providing additional updates as the study progresses.
