3. FY 2026 & 2027 Transportation Planning Work Program*

The Transportation Planning Work Program (TPWP) documents the transportation planning activities to be performed in the metropolitan planning area for the next two years. This document was prepared in cooperation with our state and local partners. If using federal funds for planning transit providers such as KAT and Knox County CAC Transit must include their funding and list their activities. The TPWP is broken down by six tasks, which include administration, data collection and analysis, short range planning, long range planning, multimodal planning, and special studies. The work program has been reviewed by TDOT and FHWA and all of their comments have been addressed in this draft document. Once approved by the Executive Board the TPWP will go through the graphics department to be finalized and added to the TPO website.

The TPO has retained a consultant who will assist us in scoping the next model update by describing state of the practice modeling techniques used throughout the country and options for model features that can be considered along with their costs and benefits.
